Harriman Yard

The Harriman Yard is also known as the Harriman & Huse Cemetery. Less than a quarter of an acre it was laid out in the 1780's for the settlers in the southeast part of town. Ebenezer Harriman was chosen as the first sexton and he is also buried here. On early deed maps it is on Lot 16 Range 12.

The cemetery is on private property of the Aucoin farm on a dirt lane leading south from 170 Baker Road, about a tenth of a mile down the lane. There are only 13 identified plots. Many of the memorials are uninscribed field stones. The oldest inscription is that of Joshua Harriman who died March 15, 1812, at the age of 68. The most recent is of Lydia Harriman, wife of Eldad Harriman, who died January 15, 1860.
